HERE IS FOOD FOR THOUGHT

A recent study of the financial administration of a city of about 600,000 population showed that, out of 18 cities of comparable rank, the city in question was surpassed in per capita expenditure on education proper by fifteen cities and by only three in expenditure on business overhead. Eleven of the cities spent more on teachers' salaries and only three spent more on salaries of caretakers and other employees.

What are the facts for Toronto?

- 11 Time is now wasted in assuing individual salary cheques to officials.
- 12 Salary lists are now made up and checked and initialled by the same official.
- 13 Four hundred signatures now do the work of
- 14 The same official now makes up the pay-rolls and pays wages.

- 16 Now such advances are sometimes made without proper authority.
