Let us help the city departments now, by

1. Urging upon the aldermen in our Ward the necessity for the immediate appointment of a Fire Prevention Commission with adequate powers and financial support;
2. Co-operating with this Commission at all times by reporting infractions of city ordinances and by making suggestions as to improved methods;
3. Making a personal inspection of all premises over which we have any jurisdiction to see
 - (a) That there is no unnecessary accumulation of inflammable materials;
 - (b) That there are sufficient safety appliances to insure a reasonable chance of escape for all in the building in case of fire or panic;
4. Supporting citizen organizations to represent the interests of all citizens between election times and to co-operate with city officials at all times when co-operation is desired or desirable. The ratepayers' association in your own Ward is one of these organizations.
