Unemployment

It cannot be settled
by an emergency device.

Why not attempt the formation of a **self-recreative fund** to be used in making or helping others to make productive employment?

The war has increased our burden. It has also increased our opportunities. Germany's toy trade lies open to us. Perhaps other avenues will appear.
