## Role of Toronto in Industrial Policy

For the last several years, Toronto has become more aware of the need to maintain a solid industrial base within the City. The loss of jobs, industries and taxes have made the importance of an industrial strategy more evident to all members of the community.

The solutions to the problems are not evident, however. People within the business community cannot agree on what the strategy should be. The planners have difficulty meeting both the overall planning objectives and the industrial goals of the City. The politicians do not know for certain which industries they are losing and why.

**Mayor Sewell** will be looking at what the traditional industrial initiatives have been and defining the nature of the industrial milieu in the Toronto Region. More importantly, he will be outlining the initiatives that Toronto should take in industrial development in the next few years.
